
DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES MEETING

What is a Registered Community Organization?

Oakland Planning and Development Corporation (OPDC), the Oakland Business Improvement District (OBID), and Squirrel Hill Urban Coalition (SHUC) are the Registered Community Organizations (RCOs) for the project area. Being RCOs gives these organizations a formal role with the City of Pittsburgh in the review of development activities and the coordination of neighborhood planning processes, including Development Activities Meetings.

What is a Development Activities Meeting?

A Development Activities Meeting (DAM) provides an opportunity for citizens, property owners, business owners, and other stakeholders to learn about development proposals that affect them and to resolve concerns with proposed development teams during the development application process. DAMs must be held at least 30 days prior to an applicant's first public hearing at the Planning Commission, Zoning Board of Adjustment, Art Commission, or Historic Review Commission.
