COVID-19 Vaccine Updates

As of April 13, all Pennsylvanians 16 and older are eligible for a vaccine. If you are 1A eligible and still have not received a vaccine, we recommend you make an appointment as soon as possible. Stay up to date on vaccine availability by signing up for the **Allegheny County Community Notification System** at bit.ly/alleghenyalerts.

Where can I get a vaccine?

- 1. If you have a primary care physician, call them first!
- UPMC is committed to delivering COVID-19 vaccines as quickly as possible. Visit https://vaccine.upmc. com and fill out a form OR call 844-876-2822 between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm any day of the week. You will be contacted as soon as a vaccine slot becomes available.
