The Green Grocer mobile farmers market is now delivering fresh fruits and vegetables to Oakland doorsteps! Deliveries take place on Thursday from now through March 2021. You can place an order by calling **412-745-6598** on Mondays from 10:00 am - 2:00 pm, or order online at greengrocerpgh.shop up until 9:00 am on Wednesdays (note that the web address must be entered without a "www." in front of it). Green Grocer is a weekly service with no minimum order requirement or delivery charge. Customers may pay online with a credit or debit card or in person with a card, cash, SNAP/EBT, Food Bucks, Food Bucks Rx, Just Harvest tokens or FMNP Bucks. Still have questions about the program? COVID-19 Vaccine Updates

The COVID vaccine situation is changing daily, here is what we know as of Feb. 11th 2021.

Who can get a vaccine right now?

Allegheny County's vaccine distribution plan is currently in Phase 1A. Everyone age 65 and over is part of this phase.

Where can I get a vaccine?

Vaccines are in high demand and short supply.

- 1. If you have a primary care physician, call them first!
- If you cannot get a vaccine through your primary care physician, you can find a regularly-updated list of providers at www.vaccinatepa.org.
- You can now call 2-1-1 for help scheduling a COVID vaccine or to have your vaccine questions answered.
